ABOUT COURT RULING

There was a meeting on January 12, 2017 regarding the concerns of everyone due to the new court ruling. Anne McNamee and Joanna Cerazy from the STA kindly attended the meeting and provided valuable information. The minutes are attached.

Essentially, from the meeting we discovered that at the elementary level, there should be 1 T-L per 500 students and at the secondary level, 1 T-L per school.

There was discussion about updating our job description but the STA advised us against it as it is a joint commitment with the employer

with possible negative outcomes for us. As a result, the executive team made a decision to not update our job description since the current one still encompasses what we do. Click here to read our current role.
